






OSM Public Library received a \$500 grant from International Dyslexia Association Ontario. The purpose of the grant is to promote dyslexia awareness and add resources to our collection.

We have added many titles to our collection, **Emergent Reader** Series Book Set (a collection of engaging, meaningful, and comprehensible decodable books in the genres of narrative, descriptive, and informational texts, and poetry. These texts are tied to a systematic phonics scope & sequence and give the most novice readers practice reading single consonants, short vowels, several high-utility digraphs and endings, and highfrequency words.) Dog on a Log Decodable books, Simple Words Decodable Chapter Books "The Kent's Quest series" for grades 2 and up, and The Reading Series One Book Set (a collection of engaging and authentic decodable books in a range of text types that includes narratives and poetry.) These texts are designed to consolidate foundational phonics skills introduced in the Emergent Reader Series and give students the practice they need to develop reading stamina and increase

their reading rate, fluency, and prosody in longer OVERCOMIN and more complex texts. We also purchased resources for parents to help them understand what dyslexia is.
